VA Providence Begins Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution

PROVIDENCE, R.I. – The VA Providence Healthcare System began COVID-19 vaccination with the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine today at the Providence VA Medical Center, following the U.S. Food and Drug Administration’s Emergency Use Authorization for the vaccine.

“The VA Providence Healthcare System is proud to begin offering the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine to our health care personnel,” said Lawrence Connell, director of the VA Providence Healthcare System. “As vaccine supplies increase, our ultimate goal is to offer free COVID-19 vaccination to all Veterans and employees who want to be vaccinated.”

The Providence VAMC is one of 113 VA medical centers across the country to receive the first limited supply of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine. Sites were identified based on need for the vaccine according to CDC’s 1A prioritization and capacity to store the vaccine at -20°C.

The Moderna COVID-19 vaccine was 94 percent effective in clinical trials in preventing COVID-19 disease. The vaccine is administered in two doses, 28 days apart. The side effects appear to be similar to those of other vaccines and are short-lived.

Thirty-seven medical centers began offering the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine to health care personnel and Veterans Dec. 14. Fifteen additional VA facilities will receive an allocation of Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine the week of December 21.

Even after receiving COVID-19 vaccination, employees and Veterans should continue wearing face coverings, practicing physical distancing and washing hands often.

As more vaccine becomes available, VA care teams will reach out to eligible Veterans to schedule vaccinations. There is no need to preregister or come to a facility to sign up.
